Looking out at the community that gathered for the dedication of the Holderness Presbyterian House, I realized that this is what our Presbytery neighborhood is suppose to look like: churches partnering together to share in ministry and fellowship. To be a strong neighborhood you need at least three things: a common location,

relationships with your neighbors, and a shared sense of mission or purpose.

Campus ministry in Greensboro is a neighborhood ministry. We serve three college campuses and have more than a dozen partner congregations. We have students who experience multiple parts of Presbyterian ministry in Greensboro. For those who

might think that churches are in “competition” with each other, the campus ministry is a reminder that it takes the entire neighborhood to do the work of the gospel in this place. We have a shared mission to proclaim the good news of the gospel and to be the hands and feet of Christ in this place. This ministry belongs to the entire neighborhood (and if you are reading this, that includes you as well).

In trying economic times, we need to be mindful of how we are connected - we are a neighborhood built on relationships with a shared mission. PCM will grow in its ministry and mission only if we act like a neighborhood and work together for the sake of the gospel.

If you find yourself in this corner of the neighborhood, stop by and sit on our porch for a while. We enjoy visiting with our neighbors. ☐

ALUMNI PROFILE - LOUISE “COFFEE” MAXWELL WORTH (WCUNC 1940)

This year UNCG awarded the Alumni Distinguished Service Award to Louise “Coffee” Worth. Mrs. Worth is the former Director of Presbyterian Campus Ministry at WCUNC in the 1940’s (known as Westminster Fellowship in those days). She married her husband, George in 1950 and they served as Presbyterian Missionaries in Korea for 20 years.

Mrs. Worth was recognized for her contributions in the field of education, notably setting up the first Montessori preschool in Korea. She was also recognized for her advocacy in the area of racial equality, nuclear disarmament, and human rights for immigrants. At 90, Coffee still teaches ESL classes to immigrants at Jubilee Partners in Atlanta. ☐
